Tim Plummer has taken a few unnecessary risks in his life. In fact, he wrote a book about it: Unnecessary Risks: A memoir of adventure. He was an Army officer for 20 years and retired as a Lt. Colonel. Tim's life of adventure included being shot at while serving as a UN observer during the Yom Kippur War (his life was saved by a Russian), climbing the Cheops Pyramid at night even though he was afraid of



heights, and being a crew member on a sail boat in the Sydney-Hobart race, though prone to seasickness.
