In response to a question about why PA is the only major shale gas producer that doesn't have an extraction tax, Wesley said the Republican legislators have all pledged to have no new taxes and they have also argued that the gas shale extraction tax will raise the price of natural gas heating for Pennsylvanians. Wesley noted that most of PA's shale gas is used outside the state, so we are really subsidizing consumers outside of PA.
