Those of us who have been around long enough know that U.S. society's attitude toward criminals goes in cycles. Lauren Fine, Esq., presented us with a bit of evidence that

we are moving toward a needed correction away from harsh sentencing. Lauren is the Co-Director of the Youth Sentencing & Reentry Project (YSRP), a non-profit group that works with youths who are charged with crimes. Philadelphia has over 300 prisoners serving life who were sentenced when they were under 18. Therefore, a major goal for YSRP is to keep juvenile's cases out of adult court. Lauren said some of the lifers sentenced as juveniles were those who foolishly YSRP works with accused juveniles and their

families, lawyers, and judges. YSRP plans to open a Delaware County branch in 2019. They accept contributions and are looking for volunteer help.went along for the ride during a robbery at which a murder occurred. Although they did not kill anybody, they were tried as adults and given life sentences. As Lauren pointed out, a practical argument for stopping life sentences is that incarceration is expensive and an elderly man is not likely to be a threat. She said one of the reasons for an increase in trying children as adults was the now debunked concept of "super-predators". Lauren described this as the idea that there are children who exhibit extreme criminal behavior and must be locked up permanently to keep society safe.
