They will keep the name, The Swarthmorean, because of its historic significance, but they want to expand coverage of nearby communities with the goal of increasing the number of subscribers and advertisers from those areas. They hope to politics of local increase coverage and controversies, but they said they will need volunteers to help with reporting and administrative tasks.
