### What is a PHF?

The Paul Harris Fellow recognition acknowledges individuals who contribute, or who have contributions made in their name, of \$1,000 to The Rotary Foundation.

Rotary established the recognition in 1957 to encourage and show appreciation for substantial contributions to what was then the Foundation's only program, Rotary Foundation Fellowships for Advanced Study, the precursor to Ambassadorial Scholarships. continuing contributions.

Barbara described learning about "Rotary Moments" at the District "Rotary International Foundation Conference". Barbara said "Rotary moments" are each Rotarian's personal moment when the Rotarian has an intense insight about the importance of Rotary in his/her life. During this insight, members often come to a deeper understanding of the good that Rotary does. To break the ice, Barbara explained her Rotary Moment: she said her childhood teaching about personal responsibility to do the right thing. She said her family mantra was "you are only one, but you are one". As a result of the mantra, Barbara admitted to feeling guilty since 5<sup>th</sup> grade for not coming to the defense of a bullied classmate. Barbara's Rotary moment came when she learned of Rotary International's strong network working together making a difference and doing the right thing. Others told of their Rotary Moments. Bill Hale was struck by all the work that Swarthmore Rotary members put into running FunFair. Ann Seidman felt that she was one of many when she was in India helping eradicate polio. Ray Hopkins (supported in the story by Betty Ann Flynn) said how pleased he was when Swarthmore Rotary supported his idea to help women obtain potable water in Belize. George Whitfield was impressed by the vastness of Rotary International when he saw the number of African delegates at the Rotary annual meeting he attended in Chicago. Perri Evanson said she didn't know how to help following the Haiti earthquake until she heard about the Rotary shelter box project. She and other Swarthmore Rotary members contributed money to provide temporary housing for 12 families. Mike Malone recalled how Swarthmore Rotary, in cooperation with Strath Haven High School, collected 5,000 pair of shoes for Honduras earthquake victims. Anne Hansen, who could not be present, had told Barbara that her moment came when she realized she had found an organization whose values were the same as her own.
