What is the Gundaker Foundation?

As Bill Graham and ADG David Houtz, current officers in The Gundaker Foundation (GF), explained, the GF is our District's charity fund. It is

completely independent of the The Rotary Foundation (TRF), which is Rotary International's fund. Bill said the GF focuses on giving to education, literacy, promoting peace, children's health, and Youth Exchange. In addition, GF awards vocational and technical training scholarships for second year students and considers grant proposals submitted by District clubs. David said the GF's budget this year is \$50,000. GF's Board is composed of representatives, called Gundaker Directors from each participating club in the district. The Directors meet once a month in Radnor/Wayne.



Reasons for contributing to GF?

Bill and David said District clubs, through their Directors, have a vote over the use of funds in the GF. Except for funds GF decides to award to International grants for which a District 7450 Rotarian is taking part in, our contributions to GF would stay in the local District. They said the funds for the vocational scholarships and Youth Exchange budget are completely from GF. They complimented Swarthmore Rotary because of our generous donations to GF in the past. Our club is the second highest contributor to GF over the years.

### **GF vs TRF**

#### **GF vs TRF**

When Rotarians donate to GF the funds "stay local" and are distributed by the vote of the Gundaker Directors from District Clubs. With TRF donations, Rotary International "lives" off of the interest for 3 years and then 50% of the funds donated come back to District 7450 for District Grants (District Designated Funds) and the other 50% are used to support Rotary worldwide programs and global grants. District Grants are distributed by the District 7450's The Rotary Foundation Committee. Swarthmore recently received a district grant for the Haiti Clinic.
