Since NST was organized a little over a year ago, 143 of our neighbors have exchanged about 450 hours of service. Linton said TimeBank is not just for seniors, as is evident by some of the listings. Mary NETHER - SWARTHMORE emphasized that a member isn't obligated to DTimeBank participate a certain amount. A member can participate at any rate. A Rotary member asked about legal liability and said TimeBank assumes no liability. Kathryn Jones suggested using waivers. Mary responded positively to Kathryn's suggestion.
