The recipient should have shown exceptional dedication to advancing her or his chosen occupations and to service in the community through his or her occupations.

"Community Service" in Rotary has been described as commitment and dedication to "Service above Self" in volunteer service outside of one's business or profession toward the goal of improving lives in the local community.
