## Last Meeting Summary

Liv Elicher of the Brandywine Conservancy and Museum of Art told us how the Museum has fared during the pandemic. Like most organizations, the Museum has had to reimagine how it interacts with the public. It was closed for three and a half months in the Spring. After reopening, it has limited attendance. The Museum adapted by offering online tours and lectures, giving classes on how to do crafts and expanding their gift shop online. They are even offering online nature walks. The reopened Museum has put in place a number of safety policies. Tickets must be purchased in advance of attendance. This limits the number of visitors at any one time. Visitors must wear masks and practice social distancing. The Museum is sanitizing more often and more thoroughly. The staff is temperature checked frequently.

Liv said there have been some positive developments from the pandemic. It has seen more visitors, now mostly online. Because visitors don't have to travel to the Museum, the visitors come from a bigger geographical area. It is easier for disabled persons to participate in activities. Lectures and workshops are more heavily attended.

The biggest problem caused by the pandemic is maintaining funding. The Museum had to cancel

their annual fundraising event. Liv said they have managed to retain their full-time staff.
