Gudrun Weinberg, Dave Firn Mary Hinds The mission of the Delaware County Citizen Corps is to improve the emergency preparedness, health, and safety of the residents of Delaware County by establishing a group of individually affiliated volunteers and affiliated community faith based, nongovernment, and business partners committed to augment our existing first responders and emergency management staff during times of a major emergency or disaster in or around Delaware County.

Ed joined the Citizen Corps in 2011, when he was still a Swarthmore police officer. When the pandemic hit in early 2020, Ed became the Chief, Operations Section of the Delaware County Covid19 (C19) Ops Team. This group, which, of course, is only about a year old, now has scores of full-time employees. Since the beginning of 2021, the main effort of the C19 team has been vaccinations. Ed said 125,000 Delaware County residents have received both shots and 91,000 have received one shot. He said County residents have been tremendous in volunteering to help in the crisis. The number of volunteers in the CCDC went from 500 to 3400 in one year and the number of volunteer hours went from about 1,000 hours per month to almost 20,000. Ed said there are special programs for the homebound, homeless, and patients with mental illnesses. Elizabeth Churche and Frances Sheehan, a visitor, said they have been volunteering to help administer the vaccinations. Frances said the team tries to keep the experience as pleasant as possible for those getting vaccinated. She said the whole vaccination process typically takes no more than 25 minutes, and that includes a 15 minute post-shot observation time. Ed invited Rotarians to volunteer to join the CCDC. He said we can volunteer at www.delcociizencorps.com.
