Last Meeting Summary

Last week's speaker was Dr. Karen Kozachyn, Dean & Vice President, Delaware County Community College. Dr. Kozachyn's key responsibility at the college is workforce and economic development, and is a key partner in CTEP with our club.

Being responsible for the college's Career Training and Development, Dr, Kozachyn shared the following:

DCCC has 7 campuses, 3 in Delaware County and 4 in Chester County. The annual tuition is \$6,020.00 for students from sponsoring school districts and \$7,860.00 for students from non-sponsoring school districts. The college has 19,000 students enrolled, of which 38% are male and 62% female. With the median age being 22, 26% of the students are fulltime and 74% are part-time. Sixty one percent of their enrollment are transfers from four year schools. DCCC offers 51 2018-2019: \$3,845

Associate Degrees and 35 Certificate programs. The average class size is 20 students. Diversity is important to the college. The racial breakdown is: 5% Asian 30% Black 2% Hispanic <1% Native American 5.3% two or more races 50% White The career programs offered at DCCC include Certificate Programs (20-35 credits), Skilled Trades, Emergency Services, Allied Health, and Information Technology. The college build their programs based upon community needs. The college has many community partners that offer annual internships and co-ops. The programs are aligned to the needs of

DCCC's role in CTEP is Education and Training. Currently we have a carpentry program. Our students receive the same education as those students on campus. Dr. Kozachyn assisted the CTEP planning committee in thinking through logistics. How do we do classes in Chester? Dr. Kozachyn says that she is honored to be working with the club and CTEP. She said that she is amazed at the work of Rotary in general and our club specifically.
