President Kathryn Jones reported that a service project is planned for Rotarians at Work Day on April 30. Details to follow.

Last Meeting Summary

What is art? Nicole Pollard explained that Philadelphia Contemporary has a broader definition of art then is customary. Nicole is a Curator at PC, an organization whose mission is to connect the people of Philadelphia through art and partnership. What they mean by these terms can best be explained by describing some of their projects. 100 People Listening brings 100 Philadelphia residents together to connect. The group will form 50 pairs. Each pair will meet once a year for ten years to have a structured conversation, hosted by a moderator. Youth Ambassador Program organizes 11-14 year old's in Mantua to redevelop an empty lot. They will make it into a pocket park. In the Supine Horizons project, PC invites members of the public to lie in a store front. They will be accompanied by sounds and music from a synthesizer. Their project demonstrates the value of resting and not trying to keep busy all the time.

These three examples all have somethings in common. They are done in partnership with the public. The projects are done where people live, not in spaces reserved for art. They are not what I consider to be traditional art. They are free to the public.

In addition to partnership, Nicole said other guiding principals for CP when considering new projects are care of the environment, combating climate change, educating the public, and addressing inequality.

Kathryn Jones summarized Nicole's presentation by saying that PC tries
