Last Meeting Summary



How does an organization such as Rotary know if the contributions they make to other individuals or organizations help? Do the contributions make the recipients better or worse in the long run? Would the contributions be more effective going elsewhere? Our speaker, Vibhat Nair, is

part of a new company that is trying to answer those, and other, questions.

Vibhat is CEO of Magnolia Impact Solutions. His company wants to improve financial equity by helping organizations and governments do a better job of providing assistance to disadvantaged individuals. He started his talk by giving some grim statistics on financial inequality:

- 69% of households have less than \$1000 in savings
- 37% do not have access to \$400 in ready cash
- Black households' wealth is 15% of whites.

Vibhat believes that many of the current efforts to help the financially disadvantaged are not effective. Part of the problem is the financial impact of the efforts are not being measured. His company will help organizations evaluate the effectiveness of their programs by measuring the financial health of recipients over time.

Magnolia will measure financial health by use of surveys. Their website, magnoliaimpact.org, indicated that they would ask questions about: income, income volatility, spending, liquid savings, planned discretionary expenses, retirement, and insurance.

Vibhat said their survey is partly based on research done by the U.S. Consumer Financial Protection Bureau (CFPB). The

CFPB's website has typical survey questions:

- I could handle a major unexpected expense
- I am concerned that the money I have or save won't last
- · I have money left over at the end of the month

Each survey taker to asked to describe how much the statement applies to them on a five-point scale. Magnolia anticipates using the survey results to compare different programs and organizations.

While Rotarians are generous in our contributions, we worry if they do any good. Work done by organizations such as Magnolia can help answer this question.
