# **Last Meeting Summary**

Joy Charlton introduced Renee Strehle, the coordinator of the World of Work at Swarthmore Rutledge School (SRS). Renee described the World

of Work as a way for SRS 5<sup>th</sup> graders to learn about work, town businesses, and what goes into developing a product. The students spend about 5-6 weeks designing a product that will help a person in their daily life. The school has an "invention convention" at which the students present their ideas. Finally, the students visit local firms to learn what it takes to run a business. Fifteen Rotary volunteers escorted the students on their tours. Renee thanked the volunteers and said the students loved the tours. Various Rotary volunteers agreed that the tours were a great experience. The two recipients of the Swarthmore Rotary scholarships were introduced by scholarship committee member Barbara Whitaker-Shimko and Chair Richard Shimko. Each student then read the essay they submitted in their scholarship application and answered questions. Also on the committee are Greg Brown, Betty Ann Flynn, Chris Hanlon, and Heather Saunders.

Hannah Driscoll's extracurricular activities are a great example of Rotary's theme of service to others. Hannah has been a volunteer firefighter in Media for three years. I do not remember the specifics of that ambulance ride, just that it seemed to last forever and that the speed we were going made it hard to continue compression."
