The Swarthmore and San Ignacio Rotary Clubs are preparing to partner again for an additional water purification system in the rural village of "More Tomorrow," Belize following the success of the Yalbac Water Project.

The Yalbac project came in below projected costs and in October, the Matching Grants division of the Rotary Foundation approved a request to roll over the money saved, when we did not need to install the Reverse Osmosis system in Yalbac Village Belize.

Orlando Jimenez, the Rural Development Officer for Yalbac sent a letter regarding the improved health of the people in Yalbac, thanks to the clean water that the village now has.

The More Tomorrow Project Team is looking for members who may be interested in making the 6-8 day trip to Belize in March of 2010.

### This Day in History

1777: France formally recognizes the United States

On this day in 1777, the French Foreign Minister, Charles Gravier, count of Vergennes, officially acknowledged the United States as an independent nation. News of the Continental Army's overwhelming victory against the British General John Burgoyne at Saratoga gave Benjamin Franklin new leverage in his efforts to rally French support for the American rebels. Although the victory occurred in October, news did not reach France until December 4th.
