The registration fee is \$37.50 for adults, \$20.00 for Rotaract and \$17.50 for Students. Organizers have again designed a special program for young Rotarians of High School age. The Program will run from 9:30 am to 12:00 noon.

Rotarians who want to participate are encouraged to register early as over 500 Rotarians and guests were turned away last year.
