Guy Gardner, President of Williamson Free School of Mechanical Trades, spoke to us about his past as an astronaut. He invited us to imagine the sensations we would experience from entering the space capsule to lift off. He provided some interesting facts about orbiting the globe - it takes 90 minutes so there is 45 minutes between sunrise and sunset.

Then he told us about the history of Williamson from its establishment by Mr. Williamson in 1888 with a 2 million dollar endowment to today when its 270 students study in building, machine, power plant, and horticultural trades.
