### Chester & Swarthmore Rotary Partner for Literacy By Marv Gelb

Through a combination of local fundraisers and a grant from Rotary International (RI) District 7450, the Rotary Clubs of Chester and Swarthmore have collaborated with

the Delaware County Library System to expand the state's One Book, Every Young Child 2011 initiative in Chester, PA.

This Pennsylvania literacy project for children ages 3 to 6 is currently in its fifth year of working to improve early literacy development in preschoolers. Yesterday, on behalf of RI District 7450, **Vasanth Prabhu** and **Russ deFuria** presented a check to the Rotary Clubs of Chester and Swarthmore to match the clubs' fundraising efforts. Funds will be used to purchase materials needed to share this effective project with 720 children in Chester pre-school centers.

### A Visit to the Grand Cayman Rotary Club By Marv Gelb

During my vacation in Grand Cayman (BWI), I attended the Grand Cayman Rotary Club Luncheon. It was a "business meeting" agenda which was very informative. The Grand Cayman Island has several Rotary Clubs and I was informed that they have the highest number of Rotarians per capita in the world!

There were 65 attendees at lunch including 11 visiting Rotarians of which I was 1. They discussed their projects. These people know how to think big. Their Camelot project (joint ventures with heart and cancer, I believe) has a goal of **\$200,000** and was already well on its way to realizing its goal. Their golf outing (Hunger project) has a price tag of \$600 per person and a goal of \$40,000.

All over the island I kept seeing Bus Shelters with "courtesy of Grand Cayman Rotary Club". I could not believe how many there were. I asked about them and was told there are 40 bus shelters donated by Rotary. They raise the money to construct and install them by selling advertising space. Rotary's "name and presence" in Grand Cayman is very strong and very alive.

There was LOTS and LOTS of quick wit and humor ("you have a great face for radio", etc.). The Sgt at Arms kept things very lively with his innumerable fines for chatter, loud laughing, texting, cell phone ringing, etc. There were also "happy fines" and fines for "not being fined".

The Rotary Club of Grand Cayman exemplified all the finest traditions of Rotary, to wit: fellowship, service to others, integrity, fun, racial harmony, hard work and good hearts!
