End Polio Now Ride By Rotarian Dan Danese

Two motorcyclists from the West Grove Avondale Rotary Club, Dan Danese and Tom O'Neill, will be riding to the international convention in New Orleans this May. They also rode to Montreal last year. However, this year they are looking for club and individual

pledges on a mileage basis (one way) to generate donations for End Polio Now.

This ride will be approximately 1,300 miles so a penny a mile would generate \$13, a nickel \$65, a dime \$130, a quarter \$325, and a dollar—\$1300. This group has organized four rides to New Orleans which will originate from Seattle, Sacramento, Chicago, and Albany.
