Last Week's Speaker: Jerome Parker

In a return visit, Dr. Jerome Parker, president of Delaware County Community College, noted that while only 6% of Strath Haven grads go to DCCC for their next stop, nearly 23% of that class eventually ends up at the school within 4 years of high school graduation. So, DCCC is a refuge for Delaware County students. Many students come to DCCC unprepared for college. Two-thirds need

remedial work upon arrival, and 27% don't make it to the second semester, mostly because they work as well.

Dr. Parker believes we need to recommit to all levels of education. While the U.S. was once #1 in the percentage of college grads in the workforce, we are now #10.

World Polio Day in Swarthmore By Will Fairley

The Club observed World Polio Day on Monday October 24 with a table outside the Coop in Swarthmore. The team from the Club included **Cathy Darrell**, **Will Fairley**, **Craig Fava** (right), **Ann Seidman**, and **Mike Malone**. **Gudmund Iversen** was official photographer, of course. It was a beautiful day, and that worked well.

The table was flanked with posters by **Anne Hansen** from previous polio eradication campaign events. One

poster featured photos of Club and community members who have been on two-week Rotary-sponsored trips to participate in the mammoth one-day inoculation of all children in India. The other showed a row of adorable Ethiopian children showing their electric green pinkies painted to show they had been inoculated.

In India they use purple, and at our table we offered to paint donors' pinkies with purple nail polish. Most declined but quite a few went for it. We swapped ideas about the best approach to "customers". One idea worked well for Ann Seidman, which went something like this addressed to people coming <u>out</u> of the Coop "Would you be willing to donate \$1 to inoculate one child against polio as part of the Rotary International campaign to eradicate polio worldwide." Total netted for the day was \$107.02.
