Polio eradication shifts into emergency mode ---Reprinted from Rotary International News -- 25 May 2012

Despite the dramatic drop in polio cases in the last year, the threat of continued transmission due to funding and immunization gaps has driven the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI) to launch the Global Polio Emergency Action Plan 2012-13. The plan aims to boost vaccination coverage in the three remaining polio-endemic countries -- Nigeria, Pakistan,

and Afghanistan - to levels needed to stop polio transmission. Health ministers meeting at the World Health Assembly in Geneva adopted a resolution on 25 May that declared "the completion of polio eradication to be a programmatic emergency for global public health."

Our Swarthmore Rotary Club contributed \$2311 in Happy Dollars in the last year – enough to immunize 8,162 children. Yet the need continues to grow.

In giving the awards, Will Fairley, the incoming 2012-2013 President of the Swarthmore Rotary Club, said the following about the recipients.

"Susan Kelly has devoted herself to the preservation and improvement of Little Crum Creek Park as a wetlands and community resource, served for years on the Environmental Advisory Board to Borough Council, and is its current Chair. She has been an independent voice in town planning, and is behind those beautiful flowers and plantings at the Swim Club.

"When John Shankweiler, Director of Choral Arts and Musical Theatre, came to Strath Haven High School in 1984, there were twenty-three students; the choral program now includes four choirs. Since 1998 he has organized an annual singing and historical tour of Italy by The Silvertones. Outside the high school, he conducts the Orpheus Club of Philadelphia, sings with the renowned Waverly Consort ensemble in New York City, and is a member of the borough's own Silver Dollar Band."
