Last Week's Speaker—Ben Berger by Joy Charlton

Ben Berger, Associate Professor of Political Science at Swarthmore College and author of *Attention Deficit Democracy: The Paradox of Civic Engagement*, reminded us that dismay over the lack of political engagement by the citizenry is as old as Athenian democracy, and is unlikely ever to reach the levels we idealize. Political participation follows tastes and requires attention and then energy, and can be increased best when activity becomes habit.



Berger thinks the presidential election is currently too close to call, and noted that the overwhelming amount of political advertising is accounted for in part by the way political consultants are paid, i.e., by percentage of fees paid to media outlets.

October is Vocational Service Month – What Does That Mean?

Through vocational service, Rotarians contribute their professional expertise and skills to address societal problems and needs, and to promote high ethical standards in the workplace.

"Rotary's focus on ethical practices as part of vocational service has been a central part of my success in my business, professional, civic, and personal life since I became a Rotarian," says Paul A. Netzel, vice chair of the Vocational Service Promotion Committee and past RI director.

Rotarians have two benchmarks for promoting professional integrity: The Four-Way Test and the Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions. "Rotary's Four-Way Test has served as an easy template for me in weighing the pros and cons of countless issues and decisions I've had to address over my

career," Netzel says. "It has helped make me a better Rotarian."

Netzel says vocational service sets Rotary apart from other service and humanitarian organizations.

Rotarians can support vocational service by

- Strengthening the emphasis on professional diversity in member recruitment .
- Identifying ways to emphasize professions in club activities
- Placing a stronger emphasis on business networking with integrity at the club • and district level -- which also is a means of attracting and mentoring the next generation
- ٠ Emphasizing the connection between The Four-Way Test and the Declaration of Rotarians in Businesses and Professions, and their importance to the values of Rotary
