PECO Crown Lights Champions 'Rotary's War on Polio: 2 Billion Children Inoculated'

Rotary's remarkable battle to eradicate polio worldwide was highlighted on the PECO Crown Lights display towering

over center city Philadelphia on Tuesday, February 23, the 108th anniversary of first Rotary meeting in Chicago, Ill. in 1905. Displayed at top of the PECO building was a motion ad "Rotary's War on Polio, Two Billion Children Inoculated Worldwide," which was part of Rotary International's public image effort to highlight the "End Polio Now!" campaign in cities all around the world. Because of the location of the PECO Crown Lights "motion messages," which are visible from the Schuylkill Expressway and Center City, tens of thousands of motorists and pedestrians could view Rotary's message.
