As discussion ensued, Reisa would work in information about art terms ("smoky layers," "strong diagonal line"), about artists' biographies, and about history. "Art Goes to School" aims to have each K-7 classroom visited twice a year. Volunteers are trained (the local chapter uses Boro Hall on five consecutive Tuesdays); Reisa has been volunteering since 1989. At the end, Reisa asked us to vote on our favorite of the artwork she showed. The depression-era photograph "Migrant Mother" received the most votes, but barely. since preferences were quite diverse.
