#### Club Assembly: Global Grants, Bonnie Korengal By Joy Charlton

Bonnie Korengal – current head of the Rotary Foundation for the District and former District Governor - described changes in the structure of grant-giving at Rotary International. Fundamentally, RI has simplified the grant structure down to two categories, Global Grants and District Grants, and increased expectations for the amount of funding per

grant, international networks of support for projects, and a higher level of sustainability and impact.

Anne Hansen described the months-long process of discussion and exploration by some members of the club and community members toward designing a Global Grant proposal focused on Chester. Joy Charlton explained briefly the current thinking about such (see reverse for more)

#### **Highlights from recent Board Meeting**

The Financial Report was approved. The club is in excellent financial shape.

The Grants Committee recommended approval of the following grants:

\$1000 for a solar power inverter for the

Environmental Center at the Tecolutia Turtle Preservation Center in Vera Cruz, Mexico.

A grant of \$500 to the Ruth L. Bennett Community Garden and Food Project of the Chester Housing Authority to develop propagation tables and supply rain Barrels to bring a water supply into the garden organically.

Anne and Joy gave a comprehensive update on the status of the club's first Global Grant proposal. This grant will be funded by the Rotary Foundation, the District, the Swarthmore Club, and by other international clubs. The grant will have two purposes: 1) assisting the Workforce Development Office of the city of Chester to expand its employersupported summer youth internship program from 40 interns to 100, and 2) assist in developing a financial literacy training program for the interns as part of their professional development. Extensive discussion was held concerning this grant program. Financial requirements for the club would be \$3000 per year for three years, or a total of \$9000. A motion was made and approved that the Board supports the Global Grant Proposal as outlined by the committee.
