### Last Week's Speaker— Joe Henwood by Joy Charlton

A retired businessman, Joe Henwood spent 7 years working at City Team Ministries in Chester and then decided to work instead on Chester's economic development. Joe and a group of 15 others first focused



on revitalizing the central business district, and then turned to the project of renovating the SS United States. The plan is to move it, along with the Olympia, to the Chester waterfront near Harrah's to create an attraction for visitors to the city and therefore a boon for business.

The SS United States, currently docked in Philly, is the largest passenger ship ever built (and was also ready to transport up to 15,000 troops if needed). It was gutted inside, and is therefore ready for re-purposing (not restoration). Joe et al. regard the ship as real estate to be developed, and imagine five restaurants and 12 levels of an entertainment district, creating 5,000 jobs. They are looking for partners and funds.

# November is Rotary Foundation Month

As a Rotarian, The Rotary Foundation (TRF) is your foundation. The mission of TRF is to enable Rotarians to advance world understanding, goodwill, and peace through the improvement of health, the support of education, and the alleviation of poverty. TRF is a not-for-

profit corporation supported solely by voluntary contributions from Rotarians and friends who share our vision of a better world.

At the end of each Rotary year, Annual Fund-SHARE contributions from all of the Rotary clubs in the district are divided between the World Fund and the District Designated Fund (DDF). The Rotary Foundation uses the World Fund portion to pay for the Foundation activities that are available to all Rotary clubs. Our district uses the DDF portion to participate in Foundation grants and activities that our club and others in the district choose. Some of both funds will be used for our planned project in Chester.

The Annual Fund's unique three-year investment cycle gives clubs time to plan high-impact, sustainable activities and the Foundation time to invest the contributions. These investment earnings help cover the Foundation's administrative and fundraising expenses.

# Rotary's response to the polio outbreak in Syria

Polio was recently confirmed in Syria, a country that has been free of this disabling and potentially fatal disease since 1999. In response, health authorities in Syria and neighboring countries have launched urgent, large-scale, multi-country immunization campaigns to ensure that every child is reached with the polio vaccine.

Rotary and its partners in the Global Polio Eradication Initiative are working together with local health authorities to activate the outbreak response. Rotary members, as leaders from all continents, cultures and occupations, have been active throughout the region to raise awareness and build support in the fight to end polio. Following are just a few examples from countries neighboring Syria:

JORDAN: In September, district and national Rotary committees in Jordan visited the Minister of Health to offer support for the nationwide measles, rubella and polio vaccination campaign scheduled this week. Rotary members secured funds for updated equipment needed to vaccinate more children, and are raising public awareness to encourage families to immunize their children by posting large 'End Polio Now' signs in Arabic on major streets in Amman.

LEBANON: Rotary Clubs have joined with the Lebanese Ministry of Health, WHO and UNICEF to help vaccinate children, particularly those from displaced families below the age of five. Rotary members will help raise awareness in their communities and provide volunteer support during national immunization campaigns scheduled for early November and December.

TURKEY: Rotary members are establishing a coordinating committee in Turkey and approaching the Ministry of Health to offer their support.
