### Last Week's Speaker—Mark Ingram By Jim Leming

Mark Ingram gave the club an overview of the current state of athletics at Temple University and their vision for the future. He cited compelling statistics that support Temple's belief that investment in athletic programs supports the overall wellness of the university community, including academic programs. Among the points he cited:

- Temple has 687 student athletes in 24 sports. The graduation rate for all sports is 78%, above average for NCAA schools, and better than the student body as a whole providing a model for achievement for all students.
- Temple is now in the American Athletic Conference, and all sports are played in that conference. Schools in that conference are located in 8 of the top 50 TV markets, providing Temple exposure to prospective students outside Philadelphia.
- Data shows that sports programs bring alumni together, who then get engaged in other campus activities and increase their support for academic programs. (cont'd. on reverse)

Following last month's earthquake and Friday's Typhoon Haiyan, ShelterBox has already deployed all its aid pre-positioned at the former US air base at Clark on Luzon island. With more response teams arriving in the coming days, ShelterBox is now assessing the need to call on other stock held at Dubai, at Subang near Kuala Lumpur in Malaysia, Melbourne in Australia and at its Cornwall HQ in Helston.

Having weathered the storm on Bohol island, ShelterBox Response Team member Mark Dyer is now busy with colleagues helping local people and organisations to cope with the aftermath. He says, 'Many people on Bohol were already living in tented structures, and away from their usual homes, after the earthquake. We had been setting up camps and putting people back on their own property. The first shipments of emergency assistance have started to arrive to the affected areas, with aid agencies warning the extent of the devastation wreaked by the Typhoon have severely hampered the logistics of bringing vital shelter, food or clean water to the millions affected.

The <u>ShelterBox</u> is a simple and effective solution in disaster response. It delivers the essentials a family needs to survive in the immediate aftermath of a disaster, such as the terrible aftermath of Super Typhoon Haiyan. Each box contains a disaster relief tent for an extended family, blankets, groundsheets, water storage and filtration equipment, cooking utensils, a basic tool kit, a children's activity pack and other vital items. Regarding the football program, Mark noted that Temple is the only BCS school in Philly. All home football games are played in the Linc. This year, 33 of 44 football players are true freshmen – youngest team in the country. So there is great potential in the coming years. He also noted that Temple has the 6<sup>th</sup> winningest men's basketball program in the country.

He stated that Temple has 39,000 students, and in spite of being an inner city school, it is one of the safest campuses in the country. (Chief Craig commented on his experience with the highly competent security force at Temple.) Mark said that there are big changes ahead, and to expect announcements soon regarding an expanded footprint of the campus. Those changes will have an impact on the economic development around North Broad.
