Beeman is Prof. Emeritus of History from UPenn and author of 8 books about the American Revolution. He spoke with us eloquently from his most recent, and prize-winning, book Plain Honest Men, about the 38 men who gathered

in Philadelphia to create what became the American Constitution. He spoke in particular about the different kinds of leadership provided by James Wilson, Robert Morris, Roger Sherman, and especially by James Madison, George Washington, and Ben Franklin.

Beeman made explicit comparisons of these successful deliberations to the stalemates and impasses of the current Congress. Among those factors he thinks made a difference are (1) they held conversations among themselves only, without immediate scrutiny by others, which allowed them to float ideas; (2) they met in a small room, which allowed a kind of intimacy and lent itself to consensus; (3) they followed the etiquette of 18<sup>th</sup> century civility and politeness; and (4) outside the deliberations, they set disagreements aside and socialized as a group, eating and drinking (a lot) together. Our current Congress could learn something from this part of American history.

#### Rotary Clubs Take Action for Typhoonravaged Philippines From Rotary .org

Last week, we reported in CogNotes how Rotarians in the Phillipines are working through Shelter Box to provide relief for their country. So far, Rotary partner ShelterBox has committed aid for 4,000 families in the form of

emergency shelter and other relief assistance. Such disasters are "exactly why we entered into our partnership with ShelterBox," says Rotary International President, Ron Burton, who urged Rotary Clubs worldwide to get involved. "It gives Rotary members worldwide the opportunity to respond immediately and in a very meaningful way to the life-threatening conditions faced by the people of the Philippines."

"I know we all want to help. I am urging our clubs to take action to provide emergency aid now and begin planning for the future when we can help rebuild homes, schools, and businesses," says Burton. "We are in the business of helping people in need."

For nearly 100 years, Rotary clubs in the Philippines have been creating positive change in their communities. The first Philippine Rotary club was formed in Manila in 1919. Today, more than 800 Rotary clubs throughout the Philippines give members the chance to make a difference at home and around the globe.

Rotary's work to eradicate polio, our top priority, began in the Philippines. In 1979, Rotary funded the immunization of six million children with the oral polio vaccine. Rotary clubs in the Philippines have improved water and sanitation, led medical and dental missions, created literacy programs, and participated in reforestation plantings. When a 7.1 magnitude earthquake struck central Philippines in September, clubs were there to bring aid to those in need.
