Speaker Summary: "Breaking Bad..." By Ray Hopkins

Sovereign debt crises have become increasingly dangerous according to Tom Callaghy, Professor Emeritus of Political Science at Penn. Reviewing over a 100 years of debt crises he found the "architecture" by which threatened defaults were resolved has become increasingly complex while remaining fragile and unsatisfactory. Unmet obligations of sovereign states [in the form of bonds or loans held by private banks or by sovereign states] usually lead to imposed austerity in return for rescheduling and forgiveness of debt by its holders. The IMF and the World Bank are not responsible for this but play a part in the evolving architecture of institutions and practices. Semi-formal and secretive international clubs of debt holders---"London" for private banks and "Paris" for states-exist for reaching agreements that avoid defaults --- most often for the debts of weak, poor countries. Bigger states-Mexico, Brazil, and Russia-have worked out ad hoc debt repayments, often coordinated by the US.

Speaker Summary (continued)

Callaghy emphasized that threatened defaults, especially since the world recession of 2007-12, have exposed the limitations and increasing bad outcomes from sovereign debt crises. Ireland, Greece and other weak Euro currency states have suffered severe economic declines from the terms required to obtain funds needed to pay their debts. Contagion, as seen in the Asian crises of 1997-98, now afflicts "southern" Europe and threatens all Europe.

The most alarming case is Argentina which defaulted unilaterally in 2002. Over the next few years it paid off its IMF debt and provided heavily discounted new bonds to all but 4% of its sovereign debt holders. Vulture funds have recently purchased these older bonds and taken Argentina to court in New York to capture full repayment. Court decisions so far have ruled in favor of the vultures, holding Argentine payments on the new discounted bonds at risk. This process makes even more precarious the resolution of threatened of sovereign debt defaults and increases the dangers in international finance.
