I'd like to share with you the words and feelings of LaMonte Adams as he returns to his position as a Lieutenant with the Philadelphia Police after his three months in Bangkok, Thailand in the Peace and Conflict Resolution Professional Certificate program of The Rotary Foundation.

"I am starting to reflect upon my magnificent, life changing, thought inducing and thought provoking Peace Fellowship experience. What an enlightening three month life-voyage. I feel as though I have been living my life with my eyes "wide shut." What I mean is that although I have been living on this planet for 49 years, and thought that I knew something, I have found that through this Peace Fellowship, the more that I thought I knew, the more I found that I didn't know.

"This morning I shared with my officers part of my experience. I spoke to them about my visit to Cambodia and the "Killing Fields" and what I learned about that genocidal event. We discussed that iniquitous time in history, and how important it is to be an independent thinker when someone is trying to influence you to commit any immoral, unethical or illegal violation against an individual, a group, ethnicity or anyone deemed not to be in your group. That is just one of the many lessons learned and knowledge bestowed upon me with this life changing program. I am so thankful to Rotary 7450 and Rotary International for enhancing my life with this opportunity."

District 7450 should be so proud that two of the thirty-three spots in this prestigious program went to candidates from our district. Without your contributions to The Rotary Foundation, we would not be hearing stories like this.
