Doug Harnsberger serves on the board of an environmental coalition seeking to restore the Hetch Hetchy's Tuolumne river valley as an active part of Yosemite National Park. Doug

reviewed the history of efforts to make this area into a national park and to preserve its beauty for future American generations. The effort began under Teddy Roosevelt and moved ahead until 1913 with the that Raker Act that permitted building of the O'Shaughnessy Dam and flooding of Hetch Hetchy Valley in Yosemite National Park. This gave wonderful pure drinking water to San Francisco.

Last Week's Speaker (Continued)

Doug explained that San Francisco protects this area from "terrorists" to the point that his planned trip this summer with 40 friends of Yosemite through the valley will be carefully monitored, with no film of people speaking from the area allowed. Further, he argued that the water shed could provide San Francisco with its water needs without the dam and loss of the valley that has been called Yosemite's twin.

John Muir loved this area—calling it "the grandest landscape he had ever seen." Doug proposed it was a good outcome for all if the Hetch Hetchy escaped its underwater fate. By reversing the flooding of the valley its beauty would be resurrected and it would allow San Francisco to develop a better and more efficient water supply for San Francisco.
