Rotary Dream Team Trip to India 2016 Ken Wright

On Friday, February 12 Kenny will drive me to Newark Airport where I will board United flight 82 to Delhi, India. I will be one of a team of about 30 Rotarians joining thousands more from around the world going to India's National Immunization Day (NID) to finally eliminate Polio from India.



Since the 1980's Rotary has been committed to eliminating Polio from our world. Only Pakistan and Afghanistan still have active polio cases. India needs one more year to be declared free of Polio. Helping administer polio vaccine will be a high point in my life.

Arriving in Dehli, we will join part of our team for a few days tour of Delhi, Agra (the Taj Mahal), and a tiger reserve. We then join the rest of our team near Delhi for the NID. Following that we all go to a village where we will help build a small dam to provide a better water supply to the village.

Jim Rosen's real reason for speaking was to discuss Philadelphia pop music of the 1950's to 1980's and his new book "Philly Pop, Rock, Rhythm & Blues". Jim said Philadelphia was a center of early R & R in the 50's and early 60's with Dick Clark, Charley Gracie, Bobbie Rydell, Frankie Avalon, etc. After being eclipsed by the Beatles and the British Invasion in the mid-60's, Philly made a comeback of sorts with a new, more lush Philly soul sound. Of curse, while there are a few Rotarians who lived through this period, for most of us, Jim Rosen's talk was a history lesson.
