Tom Childers talked about his book: Soldier From the War Returning: The Greatest Generation's Troubled Homecoming from World War II by Rich Shimko

Our speaker, Tom Childers, said most returning vets and the rest of the country just moved on with life. Tom is a professor at the University of Pennsylvania and has written books on modern Germany and WW2.

Tom said that in spite of significant differences in the experience of the soldiers in WW2 compared with Vietnam and the latter wars, probably just as high a percentage of returning soldiers from WW2 suffered from mental issues such as PTSD as did from the latter wars.

Some of the conditions may have made the situation worse for WW2 vets. Tom said many soldiers did not see or speak to their families for several years, unlike today. Tom suggests that the current focus on treating returning vets for conditions such as PTSD did not exist in the 1940's. He said only women's magazines had articles about how to deal with returning vets. Tom said Tom Brokaw glamorized the WW2 generation in his books about the Greatest Generation. Another side of the story was the comment Tom heard many times as he was growing up "He was never the same after the war".
