## Last Week's Program: Kevin Browngoehl by Rich Shimko

I don't know if Kevin Browngoehl, M.D., is a Rotarian but in the spirit of Rotary he received a call to serve and he accepted. Kevin is the

President of the Haiti Clinic, which provides free medical and dental care at two locations in Haiti. His call came at a Swarthmore College alumni event where he heard the former President speak about the services the Haiti Clinic provides in Haiti. When he approached the speaker afterwards to offer his help, the speaker said "Good, you can be the next president."

The clinic provides care all year in locations that don't have electricity or running water. Kevin spoke in particular about the dental program at the clinics. Partly through funding provided by Swarthmore Rotary, the Clinic was able to buy a dental chair and a generator at one of the clinics. Now the dentist can operate a dental drill and fill cavities. Otherwise, he could
