Last Week's Program: Ken Hemphill by Rich Shimko

Ken Hemphill showed us a map of Delaware County indicating open, or green, spaces. There is not much left. Ken, of Save Marple Greenspace (SMG), is try-



ing to save one of the few remaining private green spaces left, the Don Guanella property in Marple. So far SMG has been able to pressure Marple Council to deny one development effort. Ken listed some of the benefits of greenspaces: increases nearby property values, doesn't add to traffic congestion, decreases creek flooding, and absorbs air pollution. Ken said Delaware County governments are generally pro-development and do not support greenspace initiatives unless they are pressured by the public. Perhaps this says something about the type of person who goes into local government, those that favor development. .(continued on reverse)
