How you talk about Rotary and your club shapes the public's perception of who we are and what we do. Here are some suggested talking points from Rotary.org's Public Relations Manual.

- ⇒ Rotary's chief roles are fundraising, advocacy, and mobilizing volunteers.
- \Rightarrow Rotary brings together a global network of volunteer leaders dedicated to tackling the world's most pressing humanitarian challenges.
- ⇒ Rotary's goal-oriented, business-model approach emphasizes the need for community involvement, measurable goals, and maximum impact and sustainability.
- \Rightarrow Rotary harnesses the strength and experience of 1.2 million professional and community leaders from nearly every country to help families in need.
- \Rightarrow Rotary provides a platform for successful men and women of all ethnicities, faiths, and cultures to make the world a better place through volunteer service.
- \Rightarrow Rotary members have contributed more than \$1.2 billion and countless volunteer hours to protect more than 2.5 billion children in 122 countries from polio.

Hint: avoid Rotary jargon (e.g., governor, district, make-ups).
