Last Week's Program: Sean O'Donnell by Rich Shimko

Drexel professor Sean O'Donnell gave a passionate argument for the impact of humans on global warming. Sean explained that the energy the earth's

atmosphere receives from the sun is balanced by the energy that it reradiates back out into space. When components of the atmosphere such as CO₂ block the re-radiation of heat, the temperature of the atmosphere rises. The amount of CO₂ has been rising since 1960. Climate scientist have done careful analyses of the possible sources of CO₂ and have clearly identified human burning of fossil fuel as the source.

In answer to the claims that climate change is a hoax perpetrated by scientist, Sean argued that scientist are very conservative, skeptical, and non-cooperative, and it would be impossible for them to get together to perpetrate a hoax. (continued on reverse)
