Sa'ed Atshan

I think the change in U.S. policy on Israel from Obama to Trump was easy to overlook in the hubbub about Comey, Sessions, Jared, tweets, collusion, etc. Sa'ed Atshan told us there has been a very significant change towards support of the current conservative Netanyahu Israeli administration. Sa'ed is a Palestinian from Israel and a graduate of Swarthmore College. He returned to the College as Assistant Professor of Peace and Conflict Studies.

Sa'ed gave some examples of the shift. Vice President Pence said "Israel is our most cherished ally", and is "hated by (American) progressives". Trump Ambassador to Israel, David Friedman, said liberal Jews in the U.S. are "kapos", the word for Jews who worked for the Nazis in the concentration camps. The U.S. blocked the appointment of a Palestinian

to a post in the UN because the U.S. Ambassador to the UN said she would block all Palestinians to UN appointments until the Palestinians accepted peace with Israel.

What is Sa'ed's view of the path forward? He said there are three options: violence, the status-quo, or the South African model of coexistence. He seemed to favor the last option, which he described as one state, living together with full civil rights for all people. Sa'ed said about a third of Palestinians favor this approach.
