#### Last Week's Program: Andy Hartzell by Rich Shimko

Andy Hartzell got about five minutes into his talk when he was interrupted by a question. He never got back to his speech, as one question followed another. His general topic, the role of the Pennsylvania Department of



Environmental Protection (DEP), was obviously of interest to Rotarians. Andy is Chief Counsel for the Southeast Regional Office for the PA DEP. He pointed out that the vast majority of environmental issues that impact us on a daily basis are regulated by the state, not the Federal government. These issues include drinking water, stream quality, air quality, sewage, trash, hazardous waste, radiation producing equipment, and many others. (continued on reverse)

#### December is Rotary Disease Prevention & Treatment Month – Here's what Rotary is doing to reduce maternal and child deaths:

In Malawi, about 670 women in 100,000 die in childbirth each year. The Rotary Clubs of Limbe, Malawi, and Currie Balerno, Scotland, aided by a

Rotary global grant, are working with the Freedom from Fistula Foundation to lower the number of maternal deaths by training 150 midwives to work in rural health clinics in Malawi.

In Liberia, the Rotary Clubs of Los Altos, California, USA, and Sinkor, Liberia, are helping Liberian women get tested early in their pregnancy for HIV and receive appropriate prenatal and postnatal care as part of a global grant-funded project. The risk of HIV transmission to unborn children is low, if women get the testing and treatment. The Rotarians aim to reduce the number of new HIV infections in children in Liberia by 95 percent over two years in 23 clinics run by Save the Children.

To decrease the number of deaths and long-term health issues in prematurely born children, the Rotary Clubs of Pune Pride, Maharashtra, India, and Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, USA, launched a program at a Pune hospital to collect, store, and distribute milk donated by lactating women. The program, started with the help of a global grant, is expected to grow to benefit 100 babies per day in seven years. From Rotary.org
