for the purchase of fillings, teeth cleanings, a dental chair and a gen erator for the Cite Soleil clinic in Haiti. She encouraged us to give generously to the District Foundation's annual fund because any contributions from Swarthmore Rotary are then paid back to us for special projects like the Haiti dental clinic.

In addition, Bronwyn discussed other major Rotary partner initiatives such as the End Polio Now Campaign, which has helped immunize more than 2.5 billion children against polio in 122 countries and reduced polio cases by 99.9 percent worldwide. Two local initiatives in District 7450 with World Soccer and the Phillies are now underway to support this polio campaign. She expressed special appreciation and recognition of Swarthmore Rotarian, Perri Evanson, for her generous contributions on behalf of the Paul Harris Fellow program for Advanced Study in conflict resolution and peace.
