Pennsylvania Military College (PMC, now Widener). He had an entrepreneurial flair even as a child since he told about buying goods such as candy for resell at a profit to the cadets at PMC. This characteristic continued when he co-founded a bank (what later became First Keystone) the year he graduated from Swarthmore College. It would have been interesting to hear Ed speak on any number of topics: his time on the Nuremberg War Trials, Swarthmore politics over the years, his term at the PA General Assembly. These stories were not to be told at this birthday celebration. However, I am definitely hoping to hear more of Ed's stories.
